KEY VOCABULARY

- **feudalism** (FEW-duhl-ih-zuhm) *n.* a political and social system in which a vassal receives protection from a lord in exchange for obedience and service
- **knight** *n.* a warrior in medieval Europe
- **lord** *n.* a nobleman who received land from a king in medieval feudal society
- **manor** *n.* a self-contained world located on land belonging to a lord
- **serf** *n.* a person who lived and worked on the private land of a noble or medieval lord
- **vassal** (VASS-uhl) *n.* a person, usually a lesser nobleman, who received land and protection from a feudal lord in exchange for obedience and service
