Welcome to California

How California Became a State

When Portuguese explorer Juan Rodríguez Cabrillo sailed by the Californian coast for Spain in 1542, he claimed the area for Spain. At that time, more than 100 Native American tribes were living in California. In 1579, the British explorer Sir Francis Drake claimed California for England. The Spanish soon realized that they must settle California or lose their land. However, it was not until almost 200 years later, in 1769, that Father Junípero Serra built a mission in San Diego. It was the first of 21 missions. California was ruled by Spain until 1821, when Mexico won its independence. California was then a province of Mexico. American trappers and settlers settled in California around this time. Later, the United States declared war against Mexico and, in 1848, California became a United States territory. That same year, gold was found at Sutter's Mill near Sacramento. The gold rush brought people from all over the world to search for gold. On September 9, 1850, California became the thirty-first state.
